The Board has assembled a transition committee and developed a robust process for hiring a new Executive Director for the MFRC.

This year, the Board has focused on strengthening key relationships and seeking positive opportunities for engagement with our primary funders: Military Family Services and the Chain of Command at CFB Esquimalt. We also reached out to other MFRC Boards across the country to solidify our partnership in governance and address issues of relevance to all of us.

The Board of Directors advanced efforts to strengthen and develop capacity by enhancing Board training and orientation as well as providing Board members with opportunities to participate in relevant governance training and strategic planning.

Under the new BC Societies Act, we were required to undergo an extensive (and exhaustive!) review of our Constitution & Bylaws. A committee of the Board was struck to tackle this task and with intelligence, hard work, plenty of long meetings and debate; they have produced the new compliant Constitution & Bylaws to be ratified at our Annual Meeting this year.

# How we are making a difference

We have a saying at the MFRC: if someone is important frustration and concern for many military families to a military member, they are important to us! It is our intention to support the community that supports members of our Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) and this community includes family, extended family, friends and significant people in a member's life.

We continue to encourage families experiencing the **deployment** of their loved one with services that provide opportunities to gather, network, learn and flourish in a supportive community. We responded to the high operational tempo this past year providing services in support of sea, land and air deployments. We piloted "Deployment 101", an interactive information session for family members experiencing a deployment for the first time. We connected with families by providing:

- 55 children's deployment workshops (230 participants)
- 32 adult workshops (112 participants)
- 99 network activities (1,198 participants)
- 8 pre-deployment briefs (890 participants)
- 1063 Staying In Touch calls & emails

Our children's and parenting programs garner high attendance and positive feedback. However, lack of daycare spaces throughout the area is a source of seeking quality care. With the support of CFB Esquimalt. we are able to accommodate 24 families in our small

Our professional team of social workers provides preventative workshops, mental health referrals and services, navigator services and counselling. This year, we found that gaps in community services compelled our staff to enhance services for children that support social participation, social thinking, foster mental and emotional well-being, and provide opportunities for social integration.

Service to family members of medically releasing members and medically released Veterans are an ongoing priority for us. We work alongside of members and families as they navigate new systems (medical, Veterans Affairs, education) and transition out of the military lifestyle. We had very positive responses to services that: assisted with developing a financial plan for transition; mental health first aid and; employment workshops.


Our many special events continue to provide opportunities for families and friends to gather and thrive in a dynamic and supportive community.
